

CLUB DESCRIPTIONS – 2019-2020

Anime - All things Anime! Gather with students who share an interest for Japanese animation and Manga comics. (Meets Mondays and Thursdays)

Drama Club - Designed for students interested in learning more about the aspects of theater. This includes learning stage terminology, working on acting skills, set building, and costumes/makeup design. This is a full year club. Drama club will meet every Thursday, beginning September 24, 2019 in the WAMS theater.

History Club - Will advise students interested in participating in the nationwide National History Day competition. Students are invited to work together to conduct historical research on a topic of their choice and create an artistic presentation of their findings. This year's National History Day theme is Breaking Barriers in History. Students may elect to bring their project to life through a dramatic performance, a visual presentation, a documentary, or even a website. Qualifying submissions may compete on the local, state and national level with an opportunity for recognition and prizes for their outstanding work!

Homework Club – Students may show up on an as needed basis to complete homework. A teacher is available to assist with questions. (Meets Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays & Fridays)
